# **NOTICE OF CIVIL CLAIM**

This action has been started by the plaintiff for the relief set out in Part 2 below.

If you intend to respond to this action, you or your lawyer must

- (a) file a response to civil claim in Form 2 in the above-named registry of this court within the time for response to civil claim described below, and
- (b) serve a copy of the filed response to civil claim on the plaintiff.

If you intend to make a counterclaim, you or your lawyer must

- (a) file a response to civil claim in Form 2 and a counterclaim in Form 3 in the above-named registry of this court within the time for response to civil claim described below, and
- (b) serve a copy of the filed response to civil claim and counterclaim on the plaintiff and on any new parties named in the counterclaim.

JUDGMENT MAY BE PRONOUNCED AGAINST YOU IF YOU FAIL to file the response to civil claim within the time for response to civil claim described below.

### TIME FOR RESPONSE TO CIVIL CLAIM

A response to civil claim must be filed and served on the plaintiff,

(a) if you were served with a notice of civil claim anywhere in Canada, within 21 days after that service,

- (b) if you were served with the notice of civil claim anywhere in the United States of America, within 35 days after that service,
- (c) if you were served with the notice of civil claim anywhere else, within 49 days after that service, or
- (d) if the time for response to civil claim has been set by order of the court, within that time.

## CLAIM OF THE PLAINTIFF

#### Part 1: STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. The Plaintiff, Manjit Singh Nijjar, has a service address at c/o Dyson Law Firm, #2 9613 192 Street, Surrey, British Columbia V4N 4C7.
- 2. The Defendant, Amjad Bajwa, is a realtor working for Royal LePage Fairstone Realty with an address of 306-15300 54A Avenue, Surrey, British Columbia V3S 8R7.

## The Judgement

- 3. In or about May-June 2013, the Defendant borrowed a sum of \$50,000 (the "Loan") from the Plaintiff. Loan amount was given to the Defendant as follows:
  - a. On May 13, 2013, the Defendant received a cheque from the Plaintiff in the amount of \$12,500.00;
  - b. On June 4, 2013, the Defendant received a cheque from the Plaintiff in the amount of \$35,000.00;
  - c. On June 10, 2013, the Defendant received cash from the Plaintiff in the amount of \$1,500; and
  - d. On June 24, 2013, the Defendant received cash from the Plaintiff in the amount of \$1,000.
- 4. Despite Defendant's promises of repaying the Loan, the Loan remained unpaid.
- 5. On November 14, 2014, the Plaintiff filed a Notice of Civil Action in the Supreme Court of British Columbia against the Defendant in case No. 166074, seeking a judgement against the Defendants to recover the Loan with interest.
- 6. On or about November 13, 2015, the court entered a default judgement in favour of the Plaintiff in the amount of \$56,945.00 plus interest of \$1,467.22 (the "Judgement").

## Part 2: RELIEF SOUGHT

- 1. The Plaintiff claims judgment for the Defendant's debt and interest arising out of the Judgement, which permits enforcement proceedings, the particulars of which are as follows:
  - a. The sum of \$56,945.00;
  - b. The interest of \$1,467.22 awarded in the Judgement;
  - c. Pre-judgement and post-judgement interest pursuant to the *Court Order Interest Act*, RSBC 1996, c 79:
  - d. Costs; and
  - e. such further and other relief as this Honourable Court deems just.

### Part 3: LEGAL BASIS

- 1. The Defendant has refused or neglected to pay the Judgement, or any part thereof, to the Plaintiff, and as a result, the Plaintiff has suffered, and continues to suffer, loss and damage.
- 2. The Plaintiff relies on the Court Order Enforcement Act, RSBC 1996, c 78.
- 3. The Plaintiff relies on the *Limitation Act*, SBC 2012, c 13.
- 4. The Plaintiff relies on the *Court Order Interest Act*, RSBC 1996, c 79.
